Celebrant: Dear friends, we gather today on the traditional unceded territory of the Algonquin Anishnaabeg people.

**People: May we dwell on this land with respect and peace.**

Celebrant: There is one body and one Spirit;

**People: there is one hope in God's call to us.**

Celebrant: One Lord, one faith, one baptism,

**People: one God and Father of all.**

Celebrant: God of all people, from every tribe and language;

**People: you called true witnesses who sang your praise, lived your grace and worked for peace. May we share their faith and live by their example, so that we might be a blessing to the hunger of your world; through Jesus Christ, whose body we are. Amen.**

**The First Reading is from 1 John (3:1-3)**

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Reader: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted

for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

**People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Homily

Celebrant: The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors: I present Marie/Eve/Hugo to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Answer: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Answer: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Answer: I do.

Celebrant: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Celebrant: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

Celebrant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this child in their life in Christ?

**People: We will.**

Celebrant: Let us now pray for Marie, Eve, and Hugo, who are to receive the sacrament of new birth, and for our wider community.

One: Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. Open their hearts to your grace and truth. Fill them with your holy and life-giving spirit.

**All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

One: Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit. Send them into the world in witness of your love. Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

**All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

One: We pray for Linda, our Primate; Anne, our Metropolitan; Shane, our Bishop; Chris, Simone, and Jarrett, our clergy; and Brian, Pastor of First United. May their ministry be a blessing to all.

**All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

One: We ask you to be with those who have asked us to pray for them, especially:

One: On this feast of All Saints' we remember all those who have died, but in particular those known to us,

especially those whom we name silently or aloud . . .  
. . . may their memories be a blessing to us.

**All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

One: May we be strengthened by our faith; may we have hope that the future will be brighter; and may we love one another by maintaining contact with each other to alleviate the loneliness felt by many. Help us to use our voice to help others. Lord, bless us as we continue our pilgrimage of life, that we may serve as you would want.

**All: Amen.**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

**People: And also with you.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks, almighty God, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

**People: Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

**People: Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

**People: Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with his gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood.

**People: Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks for you have called Marie, Eve, and Hugo to new life through the waters of baptism. Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom. We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

**People: Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.**

Celebrant: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

**People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**People: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation and respect, sustain and renew the life of the earth?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Marie/Eve/Hugo, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Celebrant I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own forever.

Celebrant: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her/him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her/him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

Celebrant: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

**People: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify God in heaven.**

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**People: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**People: And also with you.**

*When exchanging the Peace with your fellow parishioners, please remember that physical contact with those outside your bubble group is not permitted during this Amber phase. Instead, share a sign of peace with others around you by other means such as bowing or waving.*

Celebrant: Holy and mighty God,

**People: we give you thanks for the triumph of Christ in the lives of all his saints. Receive all we offer you this day, and help us, like them, to run our course with faith, that we may come to your eternal kingdom. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

**People: And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

**People: We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant: We give you thanks and praise, almighty God, for the gift of a world full of wonder, and for our life which comes from you. By your power you sustain the universe.

**People: Glory to you for ever and ever.**

Celebrant: You created us to love you with all our heart, and to love each other as ourselves, but we rebel against you by the evil that we do. In Jesus, your Son, you bring healing to our world and gather us

into one great family. Therefore, with all who serve you on earth and in heaven, we praise your wonderful name, as we say,

**People: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

**Celebrant:** We give you thanks and praise, loving God, because in sending Jesus your Son to us you showed us how much you love us. He cares for the poor and the hungry. He suffers with the sick and the rejected. Betrayed and forsaken, he did not strike back but overcame hatred with love. On the cross he defeated the power of sin and death. By raising him from the dead you show us the power of your love to bring new life to all your people.

**People: Glory to you for ever and ever.**

**Celebrant:** On the night before he gave up his life for us, Jesus, at supper with his friends, took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which is given for you." After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, said the blessing, gave it to his friends, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which is shed for you and for many, so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me."

**People: Glory to you for ever and ever.**

**Celebrant:** Gracious God, with this bread and wine we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, and we offer ourselves to you in him. Send your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts, that we may know the presence of Jesus in the breaking of bread, and share in the life of the family of your children.

**People: Glory to you for ever and ever.**

Celebrant: You call us to be your servants; fill us with the courage and love of Jesus, that all the world may gather in joy at the table of your kingdom. We sing your praise, almighty God, through Jesus, our Lord, in the power of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

**People: Glory to you for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we say,

**People: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: "I am the bread of life," says the Lord. "Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst."

**People: Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who trust in God!**

Celebrant: The gifts of God for the people of God.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

*During Communion, you will remain in your seats and the clergy will bring the host to you. A sidesperson will provide you with hand sanitizer before you remove your mask to take the host and after you have received it. If you are unable to receive the wheat wafer, a rice wafer is available.*

### *Musical Interlude*

Celebrant: Lord of hosts,

**People: we praise your glory reflected in your saints. May we who share at this table be filled with the joy of your eternal kingdom, where Jesus is Lord, now and for ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: Glory to God,

**People:** whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine. Glory to God from generation to generation, in the Church and in Christ Jesus, for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant: You are called to be the saints of God. Go from here as those who are worthy of their calling.

**People:** We honour the saints of the early church, such as Paul, who were prepared to suffer and die for their Christian faith.

Celebrant: Follow the Celtic saints, such as Columba, who were ready to endure difficulty and danger to explain the Christian faith to others.

**People:** We emulate the saints of the middle ages, such as Mother Julian, who listened with empathy to the needs of ordinary people and wrote of her spiritual experiences.

Celebrant: Look to the saints of the Reformation, such as Martin Luther, who broke free from powerful leaders and sought truth rather than obedience to the instructions of the church.

**People:** We rejoice in the saints of recent times, such as Oscar Romero, who fought against injustice and stood with the people.

Celebrant: And there are saints we know, good people, humble people, compassionate people, who refuse the title "saint" but care and strive for justice like the saints of old.

**People:** We are called to be the saints of God. We will go from here determined to live out our calling.

Celebrant: And the blessing . . . .

**All:** Thanks be to God.
