All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that Jesus answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Homily

Officiant: The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsor: I present Jasmine to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Officiant: Jasmine, do you desire to be baptized?

Jasmine: I do.

Sponsors: I present Caleb/Grayson/Clark/Ellie to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Officiant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Officiant: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Officiant: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Officiant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Answer: I do.

Officiant: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Officiant: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

Officiant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these people in their life in Christ?

All: We will.

Officiant: Let us now pray for Jasmine, Caleb, Grayson, Clark, and Ellie who are to receive the sacrament of new birth, and for the needs of our whole community.

One: *Hear, O Israel: The Lord, our God, the Lord is one.*
As we gather together as a community, let us pray for each other and for our world, trusting in the Lord, our God.

One: *Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children.* We give thanks to you for the gift of children, of new life. We entrust to you with a happy heart those being baptized today, as we ourselves renew our own baptismal vows. Through the life, strength, love and resurrection of Jesus Christ, your Son, we pray.

All: Amen.

Officiant: The Lord be with you.

Officiant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Officiant: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son,

we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever

All: Amen.

Officiant: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Officiant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Officiant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Officiant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

All: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

All: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation and respect, sustain and renew the life of the earth?

All: I will, with God's help.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Officiant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Officiant: We give you thanks and praise, almighty God, through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word, through whom you have created all things. By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh of the Virgin Mary and shared our human nature. He lived and died as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God of all. In fulfillment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering, to bring release to those who place their hope in you; and so he won for you a holy people. He chose to bear our griefs and sorrows, and to give up his life on the cross, that he might shatter the chains of evil and death, and banish the darkness of sin and despair. By his resurrection he brings us into the light of your presence. Now with all creation we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.
