Dear friends in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of Christ's paschal mystery. On this day, our Lord Jesus Christ entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph. The people welcomed him with palms and shouts of praise, but the path before him led to self-giving, suffering, and death. Today we greet him as our king, although we know his crown is thorns and his throne a cross. We follow him this week from the glory of the palms to the glory of the resurrection by way of suffering and death.

We are given a word, *Hosanna, Save us*. This word is not only plea, but also protest, and assurance. The One who comes in the name of the Lord, does come with salvation and hope. So, with the crowds of old, we lift our palms and rejoice in the presence of Jesus Christ, who is mercy and healing and hope. In Christ, we move and live and have our being. In Christ, we find rest for our souls. Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy into the celebration of those mighty acts whereby you give us life and eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL: Luke 19:28-40 (storytelling)

After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. Now we lift our branches, big and small, and we ask for God's blessing on these palms.

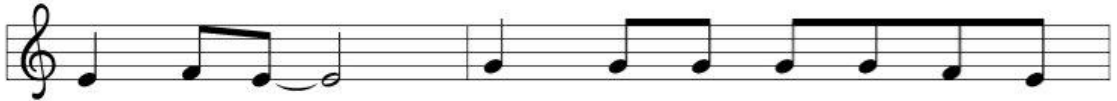

REFLECTION

THE NICENE CREED

Let us confess our faith as we say,
