## The First Reading is from Acts (9:36-43).

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Julie will also be in Steacy Hall each Sunday in May, after the 9:30 am service, to take cash and cheques and record your tax receipt information.

**Updates from the Westboro Region Food Bank.** As you may have heard, The Ottawa Food Bank has had to decrease the amount of food provided to the "member foodbanks" due to the huge increase in community members accessing these resources. What does that mean for us here at Westboro Region Food Bank? We are seeing a huge decrease in the quantity of "standard food" items that make up a standard order. In order to bridge the gap, we have been purchasing more and more of these standard items, which, of course is creating pressure on our budget. If you are considering donating, these are the top 5 needed items:

- Canned tuna, or other canned meats such as Flakes of Chicken and Flakes of Ham
- Canned soup
- Peanut Butter
