HOMILY

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Teach us to recognize the gifts you have already placed among us, and to share them generously, trusting that your abundance is greater than our scarcity. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayers.**

We give thanks for the quiet signs of your grace in creation: for the warmth of the sun, the nourishment of rain and the beauty of nature. Open our eyes to receive these gifts with gratitude and to care faithfully for the world you have entrusted to us. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayers.**

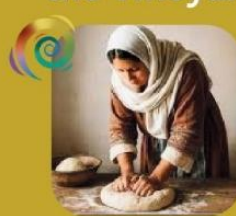

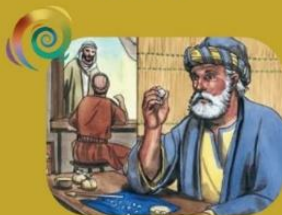

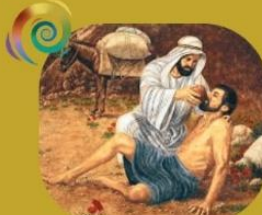
